I have at tast been able to obtain a price for a simple lean-to extension at the read of St. Francis' Church, of the same size as the present sacristy and offices, and containing the same accomposation. It is as follows:

To revise drainage, dismantle boiler and H.W.

system, erect a timber structure approx.

19 0 x 9 x 8 to eaves, covered externally with metal lath and roughcast, internally with hardboard, distempered, with flat roof covered in matching and three layers of ruberoid, with hardboard ceiling. Extension to include confessional, vestment room, cloakroom and W.C.

Included in price is cost of dismantling and re-erection of alter and dismantling of alter side screens. Decorated throughout and electric lighting to rooms in new extension. For the sum of £401. 18s.0d. nett.

I have not obtained detailed drawings but I can get these quite easily if the price is not considered to be too high. Personally, whilst this is no doubt a fair price for the work entailed, it seems to me that we shall be little better off if it is done, as it will only give us about nine more feet of seating accommodation - about 30 people - i.e. the room now taken up by the sanctuary, and it is really only nibbling at the problem.
